Baku Museum of Modern Art

The museum was built at the initiative of the First Lady of Azerbaijan, Mehriban Aliyeva and opened on 20 March 2009. It was funded by the Heydar Aliyev Foundation, of which the First Lady is head. The foundation has also created projects with the Louvre Museum and the Palace of Versailles. The museum is intended as a focus for an "eco-cultural zone" conceived of by Thomas Krens, former director of the Guggenheim Foundation, that will also include a white-sand beach, a Frank Gehry skyscraper, and a walkway that projects out over the Caspian Sea.

The museum does not have fixed subject areas. The architectural concept of the museum avoids halls with corners and has open passages and walls that meet at different angles, creating a multidimensional perspective of exhibits. Conspicuous metallic structures and the use of the color white unite all parts into a single "moving abstract structure." The chief designer and architect of the museum (2008), collection and exposition (2008–2023) by the artist Altay Sadigzade.

The Palace of the Shirvanshahs History







Construction of the palace complex began right after Ibrahim I of Shirvan transformed Baku into the country's capital in 1411. The two-story palace typifies the Shirvan-Absheron style of architecture in its 50 different dimensions and construction outlines that are connected by three narrow winding staircases.

This can be seen in the lancet portal leading directly from the courtyard to the octahedral, cupola-covered lodging on the second floor, where another octagonal vestibule at the back connects to other parts of the lodging.

The complex was built over a long period of time. The main building of the palace started to be built in 1411 and finished around the 1420s. This is a two-story building located at the highest point of the complex. The Divanhane is a pavilion that consists of an octahedral hall, and it is situated in a small courtyard.

Shirvanshahs Palace ruins

The Divanhame was built in the 1450s. The Shah's mosque was erected in 1441 while Seyid Yahya Bakuvi's mausoleum was in the 1450s. In the late 16th century the Eastern portal was built only.

Shirvanshahs Palace was partly destroyed in the 18th century by the Russians but reconstruction work was carried out from then on to restore the complex to its original state. The treasures of the Shirvanshahs palace were transferred to Topkapı Palace in Istanbul.





"Boulevard" was originally a French word, meaning a wide street or promenade, sometimes running along the seafront. The first boulevards were created in the 17th and 18th centuries in western Europe.

Flame Towers

Flame Towers is a group of three skyscrapers in Baku, Azerbaijan. The main contractor, Dia Holdings, is owned by actors that are linked to Azerbaijan's ruling Aliyev family's network of offshore companies.

The height of the tallest tower is 182 m (597 ft). The three flame-shaped towers are intended to symbolize the elements of fire, and are a reference to Azerbaijan's nickname "The Land of Fire", historically rooted in a region where natural gas flares emit from the ground and Zoroastrian worshippers considered flames to be a symbol of the divine (notably at the Ateshgah of Baku and Yanar Dag).

The three buildings (South, East and West) consist of 130 residential apartments over 33 floors, a Fairmont hotel tower that consists of 250 rooms and 61 serviced apartments, and office blocks that provides a net 33,114 square meters of office space.

Farhouse Neon ART Museum


Representative of neon art, painter Farid Alakbarov opened the Farhause neon house-museum. The unique museum located in Novkhani settlement consists of two floors. The landlord and the creator of all this lives there. In addition, there is an industrial-style area iust below the water level, which serves as a small exhibition hall. In addition to the works of Farid Alakbarov, the works of his colleagues are also displayed here. This is one of the specific features of Farhouse - it combines a kind of art holding. Different types of fine arts - from sculpture to metal painting, from painting to stained glass, the works of a number of authors are combined with these neon patterns. The neon paints used by Farid Alakbarov look weak in daylight or in electric light, or are not visible at all. But it is enough to create darkness and turn on a special ultra-violet light, so that a person is immersed in a parallel - mystical and extremely beautiful reality. Note that neon art is the art of painting based on the effect of reflection of neon paint under ultraviolet light. With the help of the illusion of light and 3D effect, neon paintings come to life.



Ateshgah of Baku

Situated on the Absheron Peninsula, the Fire Temple (Ateshgah) of Baku was a place of sacrifice founded above a natural gas vent. Fire rituals at the peninsula's numerous natural gas vents date back to at least the 10th century, although the current temple structure was built during the 17th and 18th centuries. The structure is similar to the caravanserais (travellers'inns) of the region with pentagonal walls surrounding a courtyard. However, in the middle of this courtyard sits an altar, the centerpiece of the temple complex where fire rituals were observed. The altar is situated right a natural gas vent, igniting a large flame in the middle and four smaller flames on the rooftop corners of the pavilion. Surrounding the temple altar are a number of small cells which held the ascetic worshippers and pilgrims. Debate continues as to whether this temple was founded as a Zoroastrian or a Hindu place of worship, since the structure incorporates architectural elements from both faiths, without wholly adhering to either. The most established theory places the temple in the Zoroastrian tradition, but that it has evolved into a predominantly Hindu place of worship over time. In the late 19th century, the place was abandoned, most likely as a result of the dwindling Indian population in Azerbaijan. Heavy exploitation of the natural gas reserves on the peninsula resulted in the exhaustion of the flame in 1969. The flames seen today are fed by Baku's main gas supply. In 1975, the complex was turned into a museum, and in 1998, it was nominated as an UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Gala State Historical Ethnographic Reserve

Gala Archaeological-Ethnographic Museum Complex, one of the rare open-air museums in the world, preserves the way of life, mounds, tombs, dwellings, remains of an ancient castle, 5 mosques, 3 baths and others living in Gala village from the 3rd millennium BC to the present day. Pottery and bakery shops are still operating today as in the Middle Ages. The castle monument complex includes Bronze Age rock and underground settlements, rock paintings, ancient foundations, primitive wall remains, two underground roads to the Caspian Sea and Baku in the X-XIV and X-XV centuries, a monument of the XVIII century tandir, Gavaldash, ceramics, household and decorative items, weapons and coins, canned remains of an ancient residential complex, etc. are displayed. In 2011, Gala Information Center, Ethno-Ecological Center, Antique Museum were established in the territory of Gala Museum Complex and a caravanserairestaurant was launched.
